Future Ready Loyalty Card

Our loyalty card rewards high school students who invest in college and career planning. Students earn points for taking part in Mohawk events, from meeting with our College in Motion team to attending open houses. Students can then redeem their points for up to \$1,000 off their first-semester tuition.

Mohawk @ School

Mohawk @ School gives high school students a head start on their college education. Eighty-eight students are taking Mohawk's Success Strategies course at four Hamilton schools. Students who pass the tuition-free course earn their General Education elective credit that's required for all first year students at our college.

Mohawk @ Work

Students who complete Mohawk @ School in the fall move on to Mohawk @ Work in the new year. Mohawk works with local employers to offer paid co-operative work terms to every student. And when the school year ends, Mohawk lines up paid summer jobs with our industry partners . Mohawk @ Work gives students the opportunity to earn while they learn, gain valuable work experience and make connections with leading employers.

Mohawk Career Pathways Certificate

Eligible students who complete Mohawk's new two-semester Career Pathways program will graduate with an Ontario College Certificate. Students will also earn the prerequisites required to enrol in other college programs and further their studies at Mohawk or move confidently into the workplace.
